Write the alphabet or your name 3 times whilst practising your letter formation.	Recognise and record any numbers in your local area.	Can you make up a celebration dance? Write down 5 words that rhyme together, e.g. cat, mat, sat, fat, hat. Can you write a rhyming couplet? E.g. I saw a cat, He had a hat.	Find as many different shapes as you can in your local area. Draw and label the shape e.g. clock-circle.	How many times can you jump in the air in one minute? Does it change if you do a different jump? Try a tuck jump, straddle jump and straight jump. Record your results.	Next think of 3 things that are made of each material named above.	Can you make a bonfire night picture using a range of materials? E.g. Collage, chalk, paint, pastels, junk modelling.
Research a festival e.g. Diwali, Hanukkah, Bonfire night and write 3 facts about it.	Go on a Maths Nature Hunt around your local environment. Can you find some natural objects that represent a particular number?	Outside, bounce a ball using your left hand, then right hand and then both hands alternately. Try to keep a rhythm going.	Find a tree in your local area. Draw the tree and then try to research what type of tree it is. Does it look the same all round?	Can you record yourself singing/playing a Christmas song?
